2 Introduction - ANFA Club Licensing System

- 2.1 The "ANFA Club Licensing Regulations" (ANFA CLR) is the basic working document which incorporates the ANFA minimum requirements that must be transformed into a "National Club Licensing Regulations.
- 2.2 These Regulations were accredited by the AFC and approved by the ANFA Executive Committee and applied for the 2021-2022 season.
- 2.3 These regulations apply whenever expressly referred to by specific regulations governing club competitions to be played under the auspices of ANFA (ANFA club competitions i.e. 'A' Division League / National League).
- 2.4 These regulations govern the rights, duties and responsibilities of all parties involved in the ANFA Club Licensing System and define in particular:
 - i. the minimum requirements to be fulfilled by the ANFA affiliated clubs. ANFA will act as a licensor for the clubs,
 - ii. the licence applicant and the licence required as per this regulation
 - iii. the minimum sporting, infrastructure, personnel and administrative, legal and financial criteria to be fulfilled by a club in order to be granted a licence by an AFC Member Association i.e. ANFA
- 2.5 The ANFA Club Licensing Regulations are supplemented by the AFC Club Licensing Manual which provides a standard interpretation of the criteria and assessment process stated.

- 2.6 Any license issued is based on the minimum criteria set in the AFC Club Licensing Regulations and applies to, and for, clubs wishing to attain an ANFA Club License for participation in the ANFA Club competitions ('A' Division League & National League) season 2021-2022.
- 2.7 This Club Licensing Manual is divided into two main sections:
 - a. Chapters 1 to 5 address and detail the roles of the *Licensor*, the *Licence Applicant* and the licensing bodies along with explanation of *core process* applied in the Club Licensing Regulations.
 - b. Chapter 6 to 10 categorise the minimum *criteria* the Club has to fulfil as follow:
 - i. Sporting criteria
 - ii. Infrastructure criteria
 - iii. Personnel and Administrative criteria
 - iv. Legal criteria
 - v. Financial criteria

Criteria are divided into three different grades ("A", "B" & "C").

3 Objectives

The ANFA Club Licensing System has the following objectives:

- safeguarding the credibility and integrity of all the club competitions that are authorized by the ANFA
- Allowing the development of benchmarking of clubs in sporting, infrastructure, personnel, administrative, legal and financial related criteria throughout Nepal;
- to improve continuous improvement of the standard of all aspects of football in Nepal and to give continued priority to the training and care of young players in each club;
- to improve the quality of management and organization within the clubs;
- e) improvement of the financial capability of the clubs, increasing their transparency and credibility, and placing the necessary importance on the protection of creditors;
- f) Improvement of clubs' sporting infrastructure to provide the various stakeholders with well-equipped and safe stadiums.

4 Enforcement

The regulations come into force on its approval by the ANFA Executive Committee and apply from the 2021 season onwards. License Application that do not apply for a license or submit the Club Licensing Agreement timely in accordance with these regulations or do not receive a license or do not receive an exemption, shall not participate in National Club Competitions ('A' Division League & National League).

5 Legal Basis

The Licensor has the jurisdiction to govern the Licensing System in Nepal by virtue of Article 75 of ANFA Statutes.

CHAPTER TWO PROCEDURE

6 Criteria

- 6.1. The Criteria described in the ANFA Club Licensing Regulations are as follows:
- a. Sporting,
- b. Infrastructure,
- c. Personnel and Administrative,
- d. Legal,
- e. Financial
- 6.2 The criteria described in this ANFA Club Licensing Regulations are minimum requirements. The criteria in the regulations have been graded into A, B and C
- a. "A" criteria "MANDATORY": If the License Applicant does not fulfil any A-criteria, then it shall not be granted a license to enter the National and /or AFC club competitions.
- b. "B" criteria- "MANDATORY": If the License Applicant does not fulfil any B-criteria, then it shall be sanctioned as specified by the Licensor but may still receive a license to enter the National and/or AFC Club Competitions.
- c. "C" criteria- "BEST PRACTICE": C-criteria are best practice recommendations. Non-fulfilment of any C-criteria does not lead to any sanction or to the refusal of the license. Certain C-criteria may become "MANDATORY" criteria at a later stage.

7 Sanction

- 7.1 ANFA Disciplinary Committee, upon recommendations from decisionmaking body, may impose any one or more of following sanctions in case of any failure to meet the obligations/criteria specified in these Regulations
 - a. Caution and/or fine
 - b. Deduction of points
 - c. Prohibition to conclude new players' contracts or transfer agreements
 - d. Obligation to submit guarantees
 - e. License review
- 7.2 The Club may be sanctioned before the start and/or during the season.
- 7.3 In case of any violation of the Licensing Regulations, the clubs may be referred to the relevant Disciplinary Committee of the ANFA.

8 Application of ANFA CLS

8.1 ANFA shall implement the CLS for participation in AFC Club competitions.

ANFA may also decide to implement the CLS for participation in the top division and/or lower division national competitions as per the decision of the ANFA executive committee. ANFA is free to increase, decrease, or introduce additional criteria in its club licensing regulations for its application in national club competitions.

9 Spot-Checks

ANFA and/or its nominated bodies/agencies reserve, at any time, the right to conduct spot-checks with the applicant club in order to ensure that its licence was correctly awarded at the time of the final and binding decision of ANFA. The non-observance of the minimum mandatory requirements as defined in the ANFA Club Licensing Regulations accredited by the AFC may result in sanctions defined by the appropriate ANFA body according to the nature and the gravity of the violations.

CHAPTER THREE LICENSOR

10 Introduction

8.2

9.1

- 10.1 The All Nepal Football Association (ANFA) is the Licensor in the Federal Democratic Republic of Nepal.
- 10.2 The ANFAgoverns the Licensing System using Club Licensing Administration System (CLAS), and appoints the corresponding Licensing Bodies and controls the Licensing Core Process.
- 10.3 ANFA guarantees the Licensee full confidentiality with regard to all information given by the Licensing process or appointed by ANFA must sign a confidentiality clause before starting its tasks.

11 Licensing Administration

- 11.1 The ANFA shall establish a secretariat of Licensing Administration with adequate resources and equipment.
- 11.2 The Licensing Administration (LA) of ANFA shall perform following tasks:
 - a. Preparing, implementing and further developing Club Licensing System
 - b. access and administer the ANFA CLS;
 - Provide training and support to the License Applicants in using AFC CLAS;
 - d. Providing administrative support to the Club Licensing Bodies;
 - e. assisting, advising and monitoring the licensees during the season;
 - f. informing the AFC of an events occuring after the licensing decision that constitutes a significant change to the information previously submitted to the licensor;

- The Licensing Administration will be headed by the Club Licensing Manager. The ANFA will employ administrative and/or support staff as necessary.
- All employees at the Licensing Administration will remain independent from License Applicants. The independence of any staff or member may not be guaranteed if the person, or any member of their family, is associated with the license applicant in any of the following ways:
 - Member,
 - Shareholder,
 - Business Partner,
 - Consultant
 - Director,
 - Employee, etc

12 Decision-Making Bodies

- 12.1 There shall be two decision-making bodies at ANFA, namely:
 - Club Licensing Committee (First Instance Body); and
 - Club Licensing Appeals Body.
- The Decision Making Bodies will remain independent from each other. ANFA shall provide administrative support to Decision Making Bodies.

13 Club Licensing Committee (FIB)

- 13.1 The Club Licensing Committee will operate as the first instance body (FIB) and decide whether the National License and/or AFC license should be granted or not to an applicant under this *Regulations*.
- 13.2 Powers of FIB are as follow:
 - The FIB shall decide on the license application on the basis of documents received, within stipulated deadline set by the Licensor, through CLAS.
 - b. The decision of refusal of granting license shall be made in writing with appropriate reasoning.
 - c. The FIB may request for further documentation, evidence, information and/or clarification in relation to any submission.
 Such request shall be made to the Club Licensing Manager and only prior to the meeting that decides on the application.
 - d. The members including the chairperson of the FIB will have a vote each.
 - e. In case the FIB is unable to make a majority vote on any given issue, the chairperson of the FIB will have the casting vote, which is in addition to his/her first vote.
 - f. The FIB in following cases has the power to recommend and refer necessary sanctions to relevant Disciplinary Committee of ANFA against license applicant:

- Fails to comply with any criteria of issuing of the license:
- violates and/or non-compliance of its obligations, and duties under this Regulations;
- is bankrupt or is in process of liquidation or its legal status is revoked by the Government of Nepal.

14 Members of FIB

- 14.1 FIB shall consist of five members with a quorum of three members.
- 14.2 The quorum must have among its members at least one qualified lawyer and an auditor.
- 14.3 The executive committee of the ANFA, upon recommendation of the ANFA president, shall appoint the Chairperson and other members of the FIB.
- 14.4 The tenure of the Chairperson and members of FIB shall be of four years and shall remain eligible for re-appointment.
- 14.5 The ANFA executive Committee shall fill any vacant position by appointment in case any position of FIB is vacant. Such appointment of replacement shall for the remaining tuner of the FIB.
- 14.6 No members of the FIB shall simultaneously be a member of any standing committees of ANFA.
- 14.7 Administrative staff of ANFA shall not be eligible to for appointment to any position of the Club Licensing Appeals Body.
- 14.8 Members of the FIB shall abide by strict confidentiality and ANFA shall decide on rules of code of conduct for members of FIB.

15 Club Licensing Appeals Body

- 15.1 The Club Licensing Appeals Body decides upon all appeals made by the License Applicant against the decisions of the FIB. Such decisions must be made in writing with appropriate reasoning.
- 15.2 Appeals to the Club Licensing Appeal Body may be launched by:
 - A License Applicant who recieved a refusal from the FIB;
 - A Licensee whose license has been withdrawn y the FIB; or
 - The Licensing Manager on behalf of the Licensor.
- 15.3 A written request for appeal shall be made within the set deadline.
- The Club Licensing Appeals Body shall only review decisions made by the FIB and shall consider or review evidence that has been submitted within the submission deadline
- 15.5 The members including the chairperson of the Club Licensing Appeals Body will have a vote each.
- 15.6 In case the Club Licensing Appeals Body is unable to make a

the casting vote, which is in addition to his/her first vote. 15.7 Members of the Club Licensing Appeals Body must act in an impartial manner while discharging their duties. 15.8 The Club Licensing Appeals Body has the power to make final and binding decisions. 15.9 The Licensing Appeals Body, where necessary, may request for clarification on any issue from the Club Licensing Manager. 16 Members of Club Licensing Appeals Body 16.1 The Club Licensing Appeals Body shall consist of five members with a quorum of three members. 16.2 The quorum must have among its members at least one qualified lawyer and an auditor. The chairperson of the Club Licensing Appeals Body should be a 16.3 qualified lawyer with license to practice law in Nepal. 16.4 The executive committee of the ANFA, upon recommendation of the ANFA president, shall appoint the Chairperson and other members of the Club Licensing Appeals Body. The tenure of the Chairperson and members of the Club Licensing 16.5 Appeals Body shall be of four years and shall remain eligible for reappointment. 16.6 The ANFA executive Committee shall fill any vacant position by appointment in case any position of the Club Licensing Appeals Body is vacant. Such appointment of replacement shall for the remaining tuner of the FIB. 16.7 No members of the Club Licensing Appeals Body shall simultaneously be a member of any standing committees of ANFA. 16.8 Administrative staff of ANFA shall not be eligible to for appointment to any position of the Club Licensing Appeals Body. 16.9 Members of the Club Licensing Appeals Body shall abide by strict confidentiality and ANFA shall decide on rules of code of conduct for

CHAPTER FOUR LICENSE APPLICANT AND LICENSE

members of Club Licensing Appeals Body.

17 License Applicant

17.1 A License Applicant is a legally incorporated football club and a registered member (as a club) of the ANFA who participated in the Martyr's Memorial A Division League season 2019-20, and have not been relegated to the 2nd Division League for the season 2021-22.

- 17.2 No Natural Person can apply for the relevant license as per these Regulations.
- 17.3 The License Applicant is fully responsible for acquiring the relevant license by fulfilling the relevant criteria.

18 Responsibilities of License Applicant

- 18.1 The License applicant shall provide following to the Licensor:
 - All necessary and relevant information and/or documents that demonstrate that the licensing obligations are fulfilled;
 - b. Any other document relevant for decision-making by the Licensor
- 18.2 The License Applicant shall promptly notify the Licensor in case of any event post submission of the licensing documentation that would create significant changes to the informational previously submitted.

19 License

- 19.1 Following types of license shall be provided as per ANFA CLS:
 - AFC License: this license shall grant the license applicant a regulatory qualification to be eligible to play in the AFC club competition
 - National License: this license shall grant the license applicant the eligibility to play in the Martyr's Memorial A Division League and National League
- 19.2 In following cases the license hence provided shall expire:
 - At the end of the season for which it was issued for;
 - On the dissolution of the football competition in question
- 19.3 In following cases the Club Licensing Committee or the Club Licensing Appeals Body may withdraw the license during a season:
 - In case the Licensee becomes insolvent and enters into the liquidation process during the season as determined by the relevant nepal laws;
 - In case the license issuing conditions are not satisfied;
 - In case the licensee acts in contravention to the obligation set against it in this Regulations.
- 19.4 ANFA shall inform any withdrawal of license of licensee to the relevant AFC body.
- 19.5 If a license Applicant has its license withdrawn, a decision concerning the elimination of the club from the AFC competition in question must be made by the AFC Judicial Bodies. In case of the national club competition, it has to be taken by the relevant body of

the ANFA.

- 19.6 The license provided is not transferable.
- 19.7 ANFA reserves the right to sanction a club or eliminate a club from the future national club competitions based on the applicable ANFA club competition regulation and ANFA disciplinary code.

20 Admission to AFC Club Competition

- 20.1 In addition to fulfilling the requirements of AFC License, the License Applicant must further fulfill all the requirements according to the relevant AFC club competition to be admitted to the relevant club competition organized by the AFC.
- The admission process falls under the sole jurisdiction of the AFC and its competent bodies (Competition Committee etct.).
- 20.3 The competent bodies of the AFC make the final decision regarding admission of a club to participate in any club competition organized by AFC. The License Applicant hereby

CHAPTER FIVE CORE PROCESS

22 Introduction

The Core Process describes the procedure for the issuance of the License to the License Applicant. The Core Process consists of three parts:

- a. Application Steps It consists of procedures of license application
- b. **Decision Steps** It consists of decision making process including appeals procedures
- c. Compliance Steps It consists of compliance will be

23 Application Steps

- 23.1 The Licensing Administration shall produce a Club Licensing Application Pack (CLAP) which would include Club Licensing Agreement, the Club Licensing Regulations and Core Process Timeline;
- 23.2 This Licensing procedure shall be applicable to the clubs playing in the Martyr's Memorial A Division League;

However, this licensing procedure shall not be applicable to the clubs who have joined the Martyr's Memorial A Division League in 2020-21 by way of qualifying from 2nd Division League 2019-20. Such clubs however, have to fulfill all the mandatory criteria in these regulations during the 2020-21 season in order to get the relevant licenses in the 2020-21 season.

23.3 The Licensing Administration shall send the CLAP to the eligible License Applicants i.e. existing clubs who participated in the Martyr's Memorial A Division League season 2019-20, and have not relegated to the 2nd DivisionLeague

In case the Licensing Administration fails to send the CLAP to any License Applicant, such applicants may approach the Club Licensing Manager along with the proof of their participation in the league as prescribed in 12.2(b) of these regulations. If the Club Licensing Manager finds such applicant to be eligible, CLAP shall be issued.

However, if such applicants are found not to be eligible, the Club Licensing Manager shall communicate its decision in writing within seven days of the receipt of the application. The applicant may submit an application to the ANFA Appeals Committee against the decision of the Club Licensing Manager within five days from the date of communication of decision of Club Licensing Manager to the applicant. The decision of the ANFA Appeals Committee shall be final and binding.

- The License Applicant shall submit the Club Licensing Agreement along with relevant documents as prescribed in CLAP, to the Licensing Administration within the stipulated deadline. Applicants shall not be eligible to participate in the licensing procedure in case of failure to submit the documents within stipulated deadline.
- 23.5 The names Clubs who fail to submit the Club Licensing Agreement within stipulated deadline shall be provided to the Executive Committee of ANFA.
- 23.6 The Licensing Administration shall issue the Account details (Login credentials) of AFC CLAS to Applicants upon successfully receiving the Club Licensing Agreement.
- 23.7 The applicant clubs shall submit necessary documents along with supporting documentation (if any) for each criterion as necessary in the AFC CLAS. The applicants shall complete such submission within submission deadline.
- The Applicant club may make a written request for an extension of the submission date, in case there is any difficulty in acquiring documentation and/or information from any third party such as auditors or lawyers etc, to the Licensing Manager. Such written requests shall be accompanied with proof of such difficulty in form of correspondence with such third party which shall have evidence of the Applicant requesting for the said information and/or documents and acknowledgement of such by the third party with reason and/or explanation of delay.
- 23.9 The Licensing Administration shall respond the applicants with a preliminary report upon successfully receiving the required and necessary documents through AFC CLAS within stipulated submission deadline.

- 23.10 Such preliminary report is only an acknowledgement of successful receiving of the document.
- 23.11 Upon successful receiving of all documents and/or information within stipulated submission deadline, the Licensing Administration shall sort all the documents and information received from the Applicant Clubs and shall forward such information and/or documents to the relevant and appointed expertes.
- 23.12 The experts will review the documents and report back to the Licensing Manager within the agreed deadline, through AFC CLAS; such reports of the experts on the documents and/or information of the applicant clubs shall be justified with narration and supported with evidence.
- 23.13 The License Manager shall review and assess the reports of the experts and where applicable shall identify areas or issues of concern that would require further investigation.
- 23.14 The Licensing Manager shall prepare a report based on the analysis of submitted documents, report from experts, and any other relevant reports or documents. Such a report shall be submitted to the FIB along with the recommendation of the Licensing Manager on issuance of license.
- 23.15 The Licensing Manager shall send a copy of the report and a meeting notice to each member of the FIB; such notice shall be provided at least five business day before the scheduled meeting.

24 Decision Steps

- The FIB shall review the report received from the Licensing Manager; if felt necessary the FIB can ask the Licensing Manager to contact the official from the applicant club for further clarification. Upon making review and other necessary investigation into the report, the FIB, shall make its decision on issuance of the license, or issuance of license with sanctions, or refuse the license or may apply other sanctions as laid on this regulation.
- 24.2 The license is subject to the condition that the applicant club fulfills all mandatory "A" and "B" criteria defined in these regulations.
- 24.3 Upon receiving the report of the decision making body, the Licensing Administration shall communicate the decision to the applicant club via email and/or letter. Based on the decision of the decision-making body, the Licensing Manager prepares the list of successful applicants and forwards such list to the ANFA and relevant AFC Administration.

25 Compliance Steps

After it has been issued a license, up until the expiry of the license, the Licensee must promptly notify the licensor in writing of any subsequent event, that it is aware of at any time, that may cast significant doubt upon the Licensee's ability to continue the criteria until at least the end of the season for which the license has been

granted.

25.2 If the Licensee is in breach of one or more of the indicators, then the Licensee must prepare and submit an updated version of the future financial information. The future financial information must be prepared, as a minimum, on a six-month basis.

- 1. The Licence Applicant must have a written youth development programme approved by the Licensor. The Licensor must evaluate the quality of the youth development programme before approving it and verify the implementation by periodic visits to the training and games.
- 2. The programme must cover at least the following areas:
 - a) Objectives, youth playing philosophy and youth development philosophy;
 - b) Organisation of youth sector (organisational chart, bodies involved, relation to Licence Applicant, youth teams, etc.);
 - c) Personnel (technical, medical, administrative, etc.) and minimum qualifications required;
 - d) Infrastructure available for youth sector (training and match facilities, etc);
 - e) Financial resources (available Budget, contribution by Licence Applicant, players or local community, etc.);
 - f) Football education programme for the different age Groups (psychological, technical, tactical and physical);
 - g) Education programmes (Laws of the Game, anti-doping, integrity, anti-racism);
 - h) Medical support for youth players (including medical checks);
 - i) Individual performance evaluation of players in the programme;
 - i) Review and feedback process to evaluate the results and the achievements of the set objectives; and
 - k) Validity of the programme (at least three years but maximum seven).
- 3. The Licence Applicant must further ensure that:
 - a) every youth player involved in its youth development programme has the possibility to follow mandatory school education in accordance with national law; and
 - no youth player involved in its youth development programme is prevented from continuing their nonfootball education.

Chapter SIX: Sporting Criteria

- 1. The Licence Applicant must at least have the following youth teams within its legal entity, another legal entity included in the reporting perimeter or a club affiliated to its legal entity:
 - a) At least two youth teams of different age groups within the age range of 15 to 21;
 - b) At least one youth team within the age range of 10 to 14;
 - c) At least one under 10 team; and
 - d) Each youth team, except the under 10s, must take part in official competitions or programmes played at national, regional or local level and recognised by the AFC Member Association.

- 1. The Licence Applicant shall provide all players registered in the club with full access to medical support services. These shall include, but not limited to the following:
 - a) yearly medical examination including cardio vascular screening for all its players in its first squad;
 - b) yearly medical examination for all players above the age of 12; and
 - c) comprehensive medical insurance coverage for contracted players.

- d) is a shareholder and alone Controls a majority of the shareholders' voting rights of any other club participating in the same competition pursuant to an agreement entered into with other shareholders of the club in question;
- e) is a member of any other club participating in the same competition;
- f) is involved in any capacity whatsoever in the management, administration and/or sporting performance of any other club participating in the same competition; and
- g) has any power whatsoever over the management, administration and/or sporting performance of any other club participating in the same club competition.
- 2. These declarations must be executed by an authorised signatory no more than three (3) months prior to the corresponding deadline for its submission to the Licensor.

- The Licence Applicant must provide the Licensor with information on the legal Group structure at the Statutory Closing Date prior to the deadline for the submission of the application to the Licensor. It must be presented in a chart and duly approved by management. The Licensor must be informed of any changes there may have been to the legal Group structure during the period between the Statutory Closing Date and the submission of the chart to the Licensor.
- 2. This document must clearly identify and include information on:
 - a) the Licence Applicant and, if different, the Registered Member of the AFC Member Association;
 - b) any Subsidiary of the Licence Applicant and, if different, the Registered Member of the AFC Member Association:

 - c) Football activities include:
 - employing/engaging personnel (as defined in Criteria F.04) including payment of all forms of consideration to employees arising from contractual or legal obligations;
 - ii. acquiring/selling players' registrations (including loans);
 - iii. ticketina:
 - iv. sponsorship and advertising;
 - v. broadcasting;
 - vi. merchandising and hospitality;
 - vii. club operations (e.g. administration, matchday activities, travel, scouting, etc.);
 - viii. financing (including financing secured or pledged against the assets of the Licence Applicant);
 - ix. use and management of Stadium and Training Facilities; and
 - x. youth sector.
 - d) An entity may be excluded from the reporting perimeter only if:
 - i. its activities are entirely unrelated to the football activities defined in paragraph c) above and/or the locations, assets or brand of the football club; or
 - ii. it is immaterial compared with all the entities that form the reporting perimeter and it does not perform any of the football activities defined in paragraph c) i. and ii. above: or
 - iii. the football activities it performs are already entirely

reflected in the financial statements of one of the entities included in the reporting perimeter.

- e) The Licence Applicant must submit a declaration by an authorised signatory which confirms:
 - that all revenues and costs related to each of the football activities indicated in paragraph c). have been included in the reporting perimeter and provide a detailed explanation should this not be the case; and
 - ii. whether any entity included in the legal Group structure has been excluded from the reporting perimeter, justifying any such exclusion with reference to paragraph d).
